

We are so proud to see these graduates take the next steps in their academic careers and to create themselves in the light of who they want to be.


Our wish for our graduates is to let our community spirit bring us back together, again and again, richer for our experiences, with offerings of wisdom for those who follow in their footsteps.

2017/2018 Accomplishments

- Friends Served 173 children (infants -8th grade), 59 of whom have identified special needs
- Fifty-nine children received special education services, including Resource Instruction, language supports, sensory calming strategies, behavioral intervention plans, and specially designed instruction.
- We introduced two new community building events: Trunk or Treat, & The Great Thanksgiving Day Feast

 Maintained the status of Certified Non-Public School through the Kentucky Department of Education

 Maintained our accreditation through the National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC)

 Maintained provisional accreditation through the Independent Schools Association of the Central States (ISACS)


 Received grant funding from The Hearts Path Charitable Foundation, J&L Foundation, WHAS Crusade for Children, Kosair Charities

Student Body Composition 2017-2018






At Friends School, we provide:
